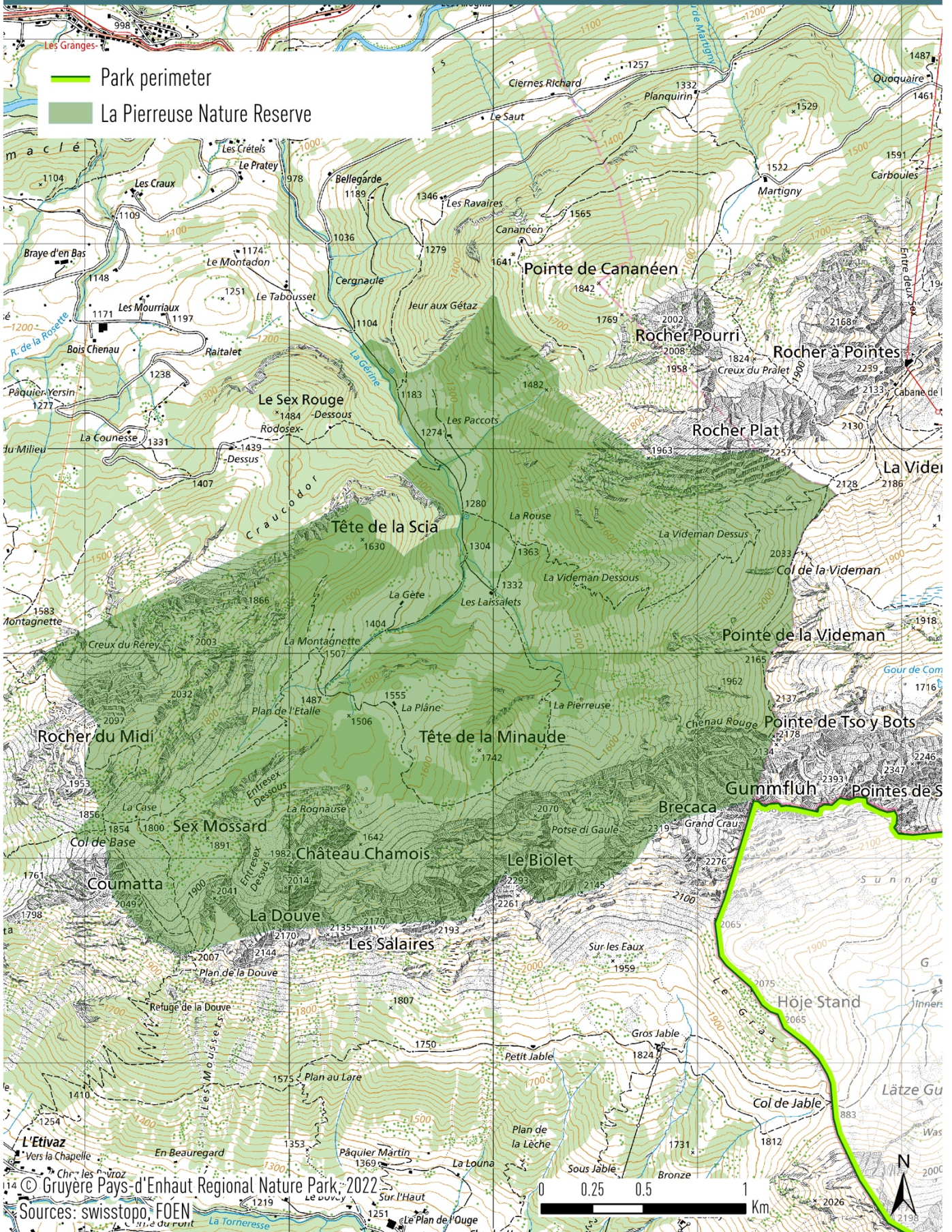

## La Pierreuse Nature Reserve

### Current regulations

### Article 3 of the La Pierreuse nature reserve (Château d'Œx) regulations

The following acts are prohibited within the perimeter of the reserve:

- a** hunting, killing, wounding or catching any wild animal, and disturbing nests, eggs and broods;
- b** disturbing or pursuing wild animals and livestock;
- c** picking, uprooting and destroying organic matter (plants, flowers, mosses, trees);
- d** setting fires beyond the confines of chalets, with the exception of the 1st August fire on the Rocher du Midi and fires which are lit for forest management purposes;
- e** discarding and leaving any litter or waste (paper, glass, tins, etc.);
- f** cutting wood, unless with the express permission of the owners;
- g** bringing dogs, except trained police dogs;
- h** carrying fire arms, vascula or contraptions to trap or catch game;
- i** filming in a professional capacity or for commercial purposes unless with a special permit issued by the reserve's commission;
- j** taking any action that is harmful or contrary to the purpose of the reserve;
- k** arriving by helicopter or by similar aircraft and flying over the reserve at low altitude.

### Article 2 of the La Pierreuse nature reserve (Château d'Œx) regulations

La Pierreuse is a flora and fauna reserve that is open to the public according to the conditions stipulated in the present regulations.

The reserve can be reached on foot. Vehicles are prohibited from crossing the Les Leyssalets bridge or going beyond the chalet des Leyssalets. Mountain farm vehicles as well as vehicles used in connection with forest management, water installation maintenance and the transport of accident victims are exempt from this rule.
